Australia's War on Feral Cats

Australia's Threatened Species Commissioner, Gregory Andrews, has declared a war on feral

cats in Australia. Sadly announcing the impacts that Australia's feral cats are having on native wildlife, feral cats have successfully inhabited 99.8% of Australia causing huge reductions in many bird, mammal, and reptile species.

Feral Cats are estimated to consume 75 million native species each per night. The Threatened Species Commissioners social media accounts have targeted feral cats, and has focused a lot of environmental concerns over the issue.

There is now a governmental program to reduce

feral cats by 20 million by year 2020. HDLN wishes to get involved by tackling the feral cat issue in the district through the Threatened Species Recovery Fund program that is currently being assessed. This will involve removal of feral cats via trapping, and also education on how to tackle the issue in the Heytesbury Region.
